I COULD BE A... policy analyst, social worker, human resources representative, event planner, journalist, librarian, marketing consultant.

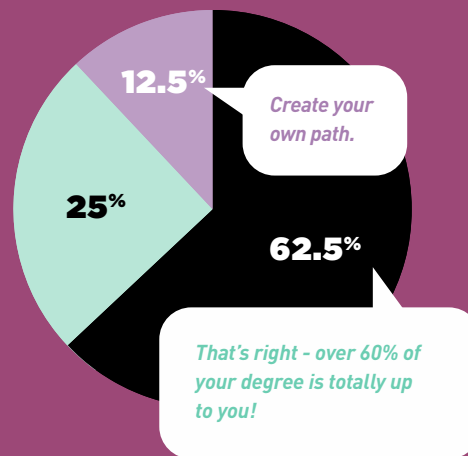
OR WORK IN... law, social work, public policy, non-governmental organizations, education, international organizations, academia, hospitality, or business.
