COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR YOUR MAJOR

Complete your major requirements and test out different classes. Design your academic plan vou're in control!

A MAJOR IN DESIGN REQUIRES:

For complete degree requirements, please see the BDes program planner for the route of your choice. All BDes students must take 6 credits of 100-level English and HADVC 209.

A Bachelor of Design (General Route) requires:

- 75 credits of DES and/or ART studio courses
- 18 credits of History of Art, Design, and Visual Culture courses
- · 21 credits of options

A Bachelor of Design (Business/Marketing route)

- 75 credits DES and/or ART studio courses
- · 15 credits of History of Art, Design, and Visual Culture courses
- · 6 credits of options
- 3 credits in ECON 101
- · 15 credits from the Faculty of Business (courses specified on planner)

A Bachelor of Design (Engineering route) requires:

- 69 credits of DES and/or ART studio courses
- · 12 credits of History of Art, Design, and Visual Culture courses
- · 9 credits of options
- · 24 credits from the Faculty of Engineering (courses specified on planner) and MATH

A Bachelor of Design (Social Sciences route) requires:

- 66 credits of DES and/or ART studio courses
- . 12 credits of History of Art, Design, and Visual Culture classes
- · 15 credits of options
- · 21 credits in Social Sciences courses (list on planner)


LATE **DEGREE**
