MUSIC MAJOR COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

The Department of Music and the Faculty of Education offer two, five-year integrated programs of 162 credits each, leading to the degrees of Bachelor Music and Bachelor of Education (Elementary), or Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Education (Secondary).

Year One may look something like:

- . Element II Mathematics or Statistics (three credits).


