### MUSIC MAJOR COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

The Department of Music and the Faculty of Education offer two, five-year integrated programs of 162 credits each, leading to the degrees of Bachelor Music and Bachelor of Education (Elementary), or Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Education (Secondary).

Year One may look something like:

- MUSIC 102 - Introduction to World Music (Element V)
- MUSIC 140 - Choral Ensemble or MUSIC 141 - Instrumental Ensemble
- MUSIC 151 - Aural and Keyboard Skills I
- MUSIC 155 - Music Theory I
- MUSIC 156 - Music Theory II
- MUSIC 280 - Introduction to the Study of Western Music History
- Element II Mathematics or Statistics (three credits).
