**Thesis Registration (Ongoing)**

Full-time students in thesis-based programs must register in each term (Fall, Winter, Spring and Summer).

**Fall/Winter Terms**

- To be considered full-time, students must be registered in a minimum of 9 credits
- This will be comprised of coursework and/or thesis registration:
  - 9 credits of coursework + no thesis registration
  - 6 credits of coursework + THES 903 (★3)
  - 3 credits of coursework + THES 906 (★6)
  - 0 credits of coursework + THES 909 (★9)

**Spring/Summer Terms**

- To be considered full-time, students must be registered in a minimum of 6 credits
- FGSR will automatically add registration in THES 906 (★6) to each thesis-based student's BearTracks account
- Courses taken in Spring/Summer, are assessed at an **additional** cost
