4. <u>Proposal for a Dual Doctoral Degree Graduate Program, University of Alberta (Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research and Faculty of Engineering) and Universidad Técnica Federico Santa María, Chile (UTFSM)</u>

Presenter(s): Janice Causgrove Dunn, Associate Dean, Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research (FGSR); Robert Hayes, Associate Chair, Chemical and Materials Engineering

Purpose of the Proposal: For the University of Alberta's Faculty of Engineering to offer a Dual Doctoral Program through an agreement with Universidad Técnica Federico Santa María. To contribute to the internationalization of graduate degree programs in Engineering through collaboration with the Universidad Técnica Federico Santa María and to recruit strong graduate students.

Dr Causgrove Dunn noted that items 4 and 5 had been in development for some time and that both proposals were well received at FGSR Council.

Dr Hayes indicated that UTFSM is one of the top engineering universities in Chile and that this agreement would foster a real collaborative research environment in areas of strength for both partners.

To contribute to the internationalization of graduate degree programs in Science through collaboration with the Technical University of Munich, Germany and to recruit strong graduate students.

Dr Causgrove Dunn explained that this agreement would build on the university's existing relationship with TUM.

Dr Elio noted that TUM is a prestigious university and the program will provide research and graduate training opportunities and a joint credential for students from both institutions.

10. Proposed Sound Studies Institute in the Faculty of Arts

11. <u>Proposal from Faculty of Science to Change the Name of the Urban and Regional Planning Program to the School of Urban and Regional Planning</u>

Purpose of the Proposal: To approve the renaming of the existing Planning Program to the School of Urban and Regional Planning within the Department of Earth and Atmospheric Sciences.

The presenters noted that this change would increase the visibility and recognition of what is happening with the Planning Program and better attract students and faculty. They gave an overview of the proposal including public support for the school and the history of the growth of the program.

Members asked about: support from the Arts Faculty Council and the Dean of Arts; the use of "school" for an academic unit; branding and identification; the relationships with Science, Arts, Engineering and Extension; and further rebranding including a new course designator of PLAN at the undergraduate level.
