Government Announcement, March 13, 2023

- Investment of \$200 million to expand health care training programs in the province - to train additional health care professionals and increase the health care workforce to meet the needs of Albertans

Government Announcement, March 13, 2023

- Specific mandates named in the announcement:
 - Provide every Albertan with access to a “health home”
 - Increase the number of rural physicians in Alberta
 - Expand the province’s ability to train physicians in regional centres and rural communities

Government Announcement, March 13, 2023

- Multiple training programs are being expanded: nursing, residency training, others
- For MD Programs: creation of 120 new physician seats at the University of Alberta and the University of Calgary

Expansion of MD Program Seats

- Year-by-year expansion of our MD Program:
 - This year (Sept 2023): 10 seats
 - Next year (Sept 2024): 20 seats
 - Third year (Sept 2025): 30 seats

Expansion of MD Program Seats

- Year-by-year expansion of our MD Program:
 - This year (Sept 2023): 10 seats - Admissions cycle already in progress - no change to processes
 - Next year (Sept 2024): 20 seats
 - Third year (Sept 2025): 30 seats

Expansion of MD Program Seats

What About the 2024 Intake Year?

- Will to fulfill the government mandate of increased rural physician training
- Admissions cycle opens July 1, 2023
- Not feasible with this timeline to create a new process for rural recruitment and have confidence that it will work

What About the 2024 Intake Year?

- At the University of Alberta, we have an established process for admitting Rural applicants:
 - Rural background is assessed by a standardized measure that examines the location of applicant's residence and duration of residence
 - Supports for Rural admissions
 - Protected seats for Rural applicants: Up to 10 protected seats for qualified Rural applicants, as per U of A Calendar

University of Alberta Calendar

- “The Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry may provide up to ten positions within quota for the MD program to qualified Rural applicants over and above the Rural applicants who were admitted in the regular process. Candidates will meet normal minimum admission requirements as outlined in Doctor of Medicine (MD) and the approval by the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry Admissions Committee.”

What About the 2024 Intake Year?

- On May 1, 2023, the MD Admissions Committee approved a proposal to allocate the 20 additional seats for the 2024 intake year towards our existing Rural seats, for a total of 30 protected Rural seats for that intake year
- Candidates to be selected through our existing process for Rural recruitment

Rural Applicants Data

| Application Cycle | Admission | % of Applicants Who are Rural | % Rural Applicants Admitted | # Rural Applicants Admitted | % Rural Students in First Year |
|-------------------|-----------|-------------------------------|-----------------------------|-----------------------------|--------------------------------|

Rural Applicants Data

- We know that medical students from rural backgrounds choose rural practice 35% of the time
 - Compared with 13% of students from urban backgrounds
- We also know that Rural students choose Family Medicine at higher rates than Urban students do

Why This Proposal?

- “Tried and true” process for selection and admission of Rural applicants
- Feasible within the limited time we have (July 1, 2023)
- Demonstrated by our data to be likely to increase the number of physicians in rural practice and Family Medicine

Proposal for 20 Novel Seats

- Caveat: would need approval from University of Alberta central administration - represents a Calendar change
- “Up to 10” protected Rural seats would become “Up to 30” protected Rural seats for this single intake year

Strategic research planning, performance measurement and support for large scale institutional initiatives.

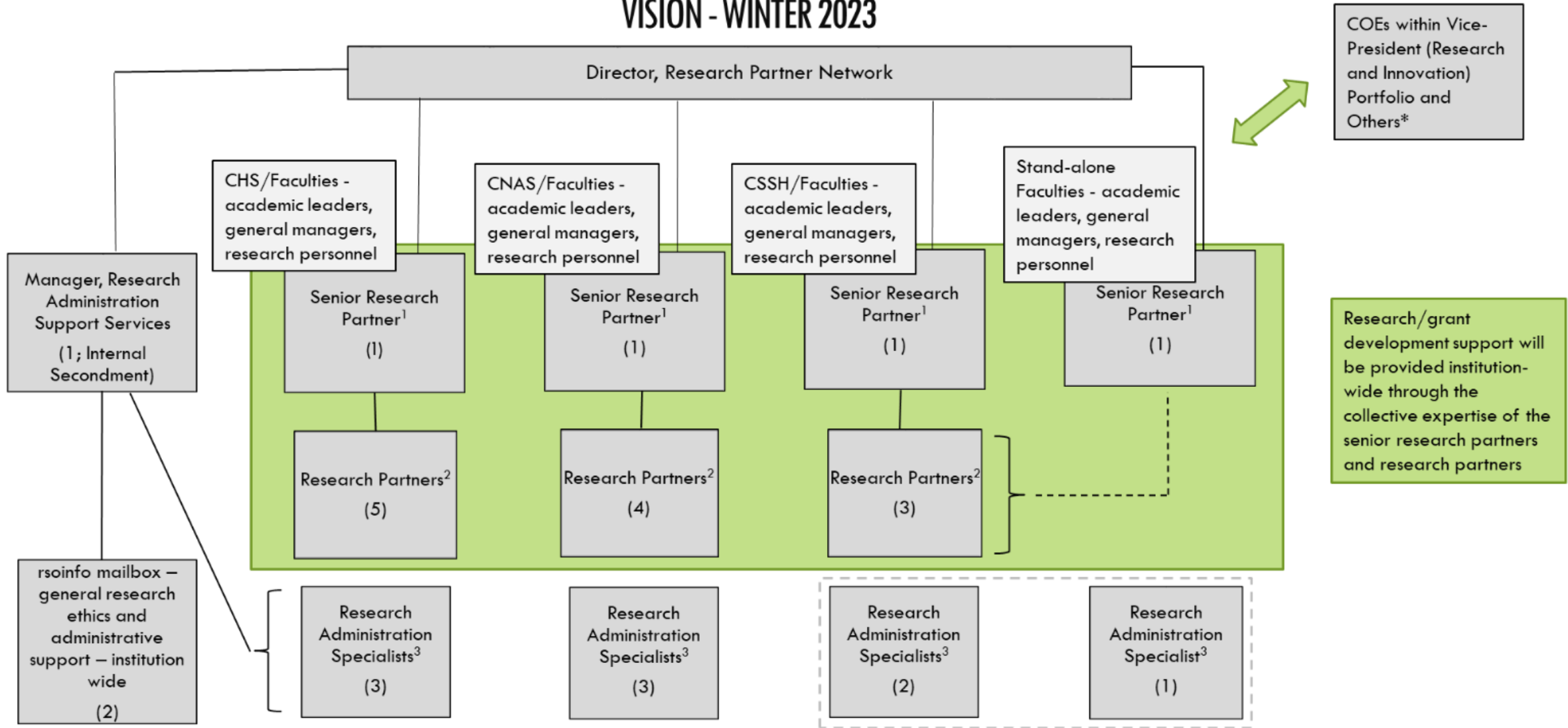
Research Development and Services

Research Partner Network

- College/Faculty-based extension of the VPRI portfolio. Ultimate goal of the network is to enable application success and reduce administrative load on our researchers
- Update re: expansion of the Research Partner Network
 - Research partner recruitment underway. Adding 7 additional partners plus filling 1 vacancy bringing total to 12 (to be completed by end of April)
 - Research administration specialists recruitment underway with posting going up any day now. Includes 9 positions plus 1 manager position (a temporary secondment to begin with; to be completed by mid May)
 - Senior Research Partner for stand-alone faculties recruitment to get underway soon (to be completed by end of May)

Research Development

- encompasses a set of strategic, proactive, catalytic, and capacity-building activities designed to facilitate individual faculty members, teams of researchers, and central research administrations in **attracting extramural research funding**, creating relationships, and developing and implementing strategies that increase institutional competitiveness.
- includes a broad spectrum of activities that vary by institution, including: **funding opportunity identification and targeted dissemination; grant/contract proposal development; research team building; interaction with funding agencies and institutional research administration and leadership**; interaction with institutional federal relations; and outreach activities and training.

Research Partner Network - Specific Roles

Senior Research Partners

- Supporting college/stand-alone Deans and Associate Deans (Research) with strategic cross-college/faculty and interdisciplinary initiatives and coordinating with college/faculty Offices of Research on college/faculty-specific research opportunities.
- Working with College/Faculty Associate Deans (Research), responsible for the overall development and coordination of the institution-wide research development support provided by the research partners. Includes coordinating work with Centers of Expertise (COE) and other areas.
- Responsible for organizing and providing pre-award support for interdisciplinary funding opportunities (e.g. NFRF) and coordinating partner involvement in special and/or large scale funding opportunities and/or proposals.

Research Partner Network - Specific Roles

Research Partners

- Will be physically located in the faculties and readily accessible to researchers
- First point of contact for faculty ADRs
- Within areas of specialization developing and/or delivering institution-wide sponsor-specific research/grant development supports. Specific examples could/will include
 - Developing competition specific communications
 - Organizing and facilitating roundtable discussions
 - Managing a successful grants library
 - Developing and delivering bootcamps/writing retreats
 - Organizing sponsor delivered sessions
 - Developing sponsor-specific proposal tipsheets
 - Organizing competition-specific peer review processes
 - Providing 1:1 support to researchers for grants related to the partners area of specialization
 - Generating competition reports

Research Partner Network - Specific Roles

Research Partners cont'

- Primary point of contact for researchers for research/grant development support
- Providing 1:1 research/grant development support for researchers. Specific examples could include
 - Strategizing and identifying potential funding opportunities (i.e. researcher has an idea, but doesn't know where to go for funding)
 - One off proposal development support either directly (e.g. investigating a new sponsor, responding to sponsor specific questions, budget development, supporting requests for data, pre screening of applications, helping write institutional sections of applications, drafting support letters, etc.) and/or by bringing in expertise from elsewhere (e.g. EDI, RDM, graphic design support, etc.)
- Management of a funding opportunity database and deadlines calendar and targeted distribution of funding opportunities to specific PIs

Research Partner Areas of Specialization

Includes:

- Health (including CIHR)
- Clinical
- Community Engaged - Health
- Foundations
- Humanities and Social Sciences (including SSHRC)
- Community Engaged - Societal
- Creative Arts and Humanities
- Applied Partnership and Industry (including NSERC Alliance, Mitacs, a number of agricultural funders)
- International (including EU, NIH)
- Engineering and Natural Sciences - Basic (including NSERC Discovery, a lot of federal sponsors)
- Interdisciplinary

Research Partner Network - Specific Roles

Research Administration Specialists

- First point of contact for research administration related inquiries and support. Physically located within the College, but assigned by faculty
- Providing tactical research administration navigational and policy and procedure support. For example
 - confirming/clarifying UofA and funding agency/sponsor guidelines
 - setting up project accounts, initiating sub-grants, and amendments
 - helping with administrative aspects of non-financial reporting (i.e. gathering back up for in-kind reporting, following up on non-financial reporting with other institutions)
 - liaising with funding agencies/sponsors re: guidelines and file specific issues on researchers behalf
 - use of online systems (PeopleSoft, eTRAC, triagency online systems),
 - File follow up and monitoring of pending approvals; helping researchers meet outstanding requirements (e.g. gathering missing paperwork, budget creation for internal funding)
 - Developing and delivering research administration related training

Some Upcoming Activities (next 6 months)

- Complete recruitment and begin integration of partner network into colleges/faculties and other support areas including VPRI COEs
 - Focusing on coordination and collaboration and elimination of duplication
- Promote the research partner network
 - Meet and greet sessions with the faculties
 - A “Contact Us” page
- Development of funder specific resources/supports beyond the tri-agencies
 - Formally seeking input from researchers
- Research Lifecycle - an interactive web-based resource for researchers
- Streamline research-related communications, including funding opportunities, policy and procedure updates, etc..
 - Working with Marketing and Communications Partner Network

Some Upcoming Activities (next 6 months)

- Update of our centrally managed funding opportunity database and deadlines calendar
- Establishment of biannual (?) researcher feedback sessions
- Development of a Research Administration Onboarding/Refresher Program and “Go To Resource” assignment
- Research administration process review and redesign
 - Updating and further defining the roles and responsibilities matrix
 - Continue working with UIO
- Initial exploration of a researcher expertise “database” leveraging research applications
