5. <u>Office of the Registrar: University Calendar Revisions to Transfer from a Post-Secondary Institution</u> (Section 14.2)

Presenters: Deborah Gougeon, Assistant Registrar (Admissions), Office of the Registrar

Purpose of the Proposal: To approve changes to Section 14.2 of the University of Alberta Calendar. These

changes provide clarification to existing requirements regarding the admission of transfer applicants to the University of Alberta.

Discussion:

Ms Gougeon explained to members that the impact of the changes set out in this document were minimal and were intended largely to provide greater clarity for transfer students. This generic policy is meant to act as a bridge to the more specific policies of individual Faculties. Ms Gougeon provided detail on several sections of the document, often noting that the term "normally" was included to indicate that some Faculties may require additional criteria be met for particular programs.

During the ensuing discussion, members discussed Section 4, under B, which several members felt could be organized, for greater clarity, into two separate sections, specifically, students who are applying to the same Faculty they attended previously and those applying to a different faculty. This reorganization would resolve issues members had regarding clarity around numbers 2 and 5 under this section of the document so that students would be clear about the category to which they belong.

Given the complexity of the rearrangement of information required, members agreed to table the Motion and for the document to return to GFC ASC for consideration once the changes had been made by the proposers.

6. <u>Office of the Registrar: University of Alberta Calendar Revisions to Advanced Placement (AP)</u> <u>Courses Approved for Advanced Standing (Admission Chart 7)</u>

Purpose of the Proposal: To update University of Alberta (including Augustana Faculty) Equivalents for new Advanced Placement courses for Physics 1 and 2; and changes to Physics C–Electricity and Magnetism and Mechanics—with an advising note for clarification.

Discussion:

Ms Gougeon noted that the changes to this document were in regards to Advanced Placement (AP) Physics classes. The changes were necessary because of the new curricula for the Physics courses being implemented for 2014. It was mentioned that the new curricula are reviewed by University of Alberta staff.

Dr Porteous made a general comment about the calendar, stating that it would be huge advantage if Augustana Faculty would use the same course numbers and acronyms as the University's North Campus.

7. Office of the Registrar: University of Alberta Calendar Revisions to International Baccalaureate (IB) Courses Approved for Advanced Standing (Admission Chart 6)

Purpose of the Proposal: To update University of Alberta (including Augustana Faculty) Equivalents for new IB courses.

Discussion:

Ms Gougeon informed members that the Languages have undergone significant change recently. The University has acted on the urgency associated with these revisions by setting up the University Equivalents now before members. All three English classes have been reviewed by the University's Department of English and Film Studies.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

8. Office of the Registrar: Assessment and Grading Webpage (with UAPPOL Link)

Presenters: Ada Ness, Associate Registrar (Enrolment Services), Office of the Registrar; Bill Connor, Vice-Provost (Academic Programs and Instruction) and Chair, GFC Academic Standards Committee

Purpose of the Proposal: To inform the University of Alberta community about the centralized resource for the Assessment and Grading Policy and related items available on the Office of the Registrar's website.

Discussion:

Ms Ness presented to members the webpage currently under production, noting that it is meant to provide to students and staff resources related to the University's Assessment and Grading Policy (in UAPPOL). The website will contain many resources, including links to the UAPPOL and Faculty-specific sections on grading and policy procedures.

Mr Woods expressed gratitude on behalf of the Students' Union for the efforts made by the Office of the Registrar to clearly communicate to students. He noted the site's potential to grow into the provision of

grading policy on the Department and even professorial levels, as well.

Dr Leskiw stated that not all Faculties have grading policy that applies to all of its programs. She also commented that professors communicate their grading policies through their course syllabi.

Dr Connor mentioned that the intent of the website is to make current information much more readily available and not to create expectations of Faculties, Departments, or professors.

9. Faculty of Engineering's Guide to Grading Presentation

Presenters: Bill Connor, Vice-Provost (Academic Programs and Instruction) and Chair, GFC Academic Standards Committee; Ken Porteous, Associate Dean (Student and Co-op Services), Faculty of Engineering

Discussion:

Dr Porteous, with the aid of PowerPoint presentation, provided members with a detailed explanation of several key grading policies and procedures, first explaining the difference between marks and grades and, then, outlining the history of the University's change from the nine-point scale to the four-point scale. Dr Porteous explained that the nine-point grading scale, which is different from the stanine system, provides a higher degree of discrimination when providing grades. The four-point grading system was introduced in 2003 because it was felt that students on the nine-point grading system were disadvantaged internationally because of the prominence of the four-point grading scale.—Dr Porteous commented that he considers this a misconception, provided that many post-secondary institutions, such as Queens University ,do not use this system.

Dr Porteous explained that the Faculty of Engineering felt that since a range around the mean grade (which was available for the nine-point grading scale) was desirable and useful, it was created for the new system. The Faculty of Engineering, it was also noted, requires that instructors provide electronic grade submissions as well as a report generated from an Excel program, showing the grade distribution. If a conflict on the assignment of a grade cannot be resolved by mutual agreement, the grade appeal will fall within the prevue of the Faculty of Engineering Academic Appeals Committee.

Dr Porteous then provided members with a demonstration of the Excel software used by Faculty of Engineering instructors to generate grade distributions.

During the ensuing discussion, the presenter addressed questions and comments including, but not limited to, the following: the new policy that requires that there is a grade dispute resolution process at the Faculty level; the issue that professors must ensure that students are made aware of the professors' grading practices at the beginning of a course or program; allowing for unique situations (small upper-year honour classes, for example) where grade distribution is not appropriate; the ability of the Excel software developed in the Faculty of Engineering to be used according to one's own distribution; and the advantages and disadvantages of various marking and grading systems (the assignment of percentages; the nine-point grading scale system; and the four-point grading scale system).
