5. Faculty of Arts Proposal for a (New) Embedded Credit Certificate in Civil-Military Leadership

Materials before members are contained in the official meeting file.

Presenter: Allen Ball, Associate Dean (Student Programs), Faculty of Arts

Purpose of the Proposal: To introduce a new embedded credit Certificate in Civil-Military Leadership, as proposed by the Faculty of Arts. The Certificate program will broaden students' educational experience by combining academic courses with extracurricular military activities.

Discussion:

Dr Ball provided members with a brief summary of the proposal, adding that it stems from a 2013 Memorandum of Understanding between the University of Alberta and the Canadian Armed Forces. He explained that the two main components of the program are 12 credits from an approved list of course offerings from the Faculty of Arts as well as completion of Officer training. He explained that the goal of this program is to foster leadership and citizenship skills for those in the Armed Forces, to shape future military leaders.

Members, during the discussion in regards to this item, provided a number of comments and questions, including, but not limited to: clarification regarding the term "senior level" within the proposal; whether students can substitute other courses than those listed within the proposal; whether the curriculum covers the issue of conflict resolution; clarification surrounding the intended target students; support for this certificate; that the military really wants their members to be well educated and that this endeavor is beneficial; that there are a number of existing cross-disciplinary certificates available and whether proposers have reviewed those in relation to the courses listed within this proposal; whether communications surrounding rules of course credit for certificates are listed in the University Calendar.

6. <u>Annual Report on Undergraduate Enrolment 2014/15</u>

Presenter: Lisa Collins, Vice-Provost and University Registrar

Purpose of the Proposal: To discuss the 2014/15 annual report on undergraduate enrolment.

Discussion:

Ms Collins noted that Ms Padfield assisted in the creation of the Report this year and that feedback from this Committee, provided last year, was incorporated into it.

She noted that the Report is a continuation of the enrolment process at the institution, and that it is beneficial to have this information in one document. She acknowledged the help of the Office of Strategic Analysis in providing access to this data through the Acorn Data Warehouse.

She explained that within the current enrolment cycle, there is close watch over international student applications, particularly Chinese student applications, which is reflecting a 12% decrease from this time last year.

Members, during the discussion of this Report, provided several comments and questions, including, but not limited to: commendation on the Report; whether there is a similar report surrounding graduate students; whether the Office of the Registrar will monitor enrolment data from China, with appropriate updates being provided to impacted Faculties; whether there might be additional post-secondary transfers as a result of this enrolment data; whether the visa processing path impacts applicant rates; clarification surrounding the increase in the Canada rates.

- Faculty of Extension proposal for Master of Arts in Community Engagement
