6. <u>Proposal for an Embedded Certificate in Engaged Leadership and Citizenship in Arts and Science, Faculty</u> of Arts and Faculty of Science

Purpose of the Proposal: To establish an embedded credit certificate: Certificate in Engaged Leadership and Citizenship in Arts and Science, offered jointly by the Faculty of Arts and the Faculty of Science.

Discussion:

Dr Loppnow explained that this 12 credit embedded certificate was developed jointly by the Faculties of Science and Arts. He added that the certificate would foster a vision of leadership which represents the competencies and attributes expected from the two Faculties including communication, collaboration, broad perspectives, depth of understanding, engagement and advocacy, autonomy and initiative, responsibility, and putting ideas into practice. He noted that the certificate includes experiential learning as well as a focus on social engagement and leadership.

Members discussed this certificate's interest to high school students entering the University as a recruitment tool and whether the language related on community was one directional. Members also discussed suggested changes to wording within the proposal.

8. <u>Proposal to Suspend Admission to the Master of Engineering in Agricultural, Food and Nutritional</u> <u>Sciences, Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research</u>

Purpose of the Proposal: To suspend admission to the Master of Engineering in Agricultural, Food and Nutritional Sciences

Discussion:

Dr Naeth reported that the current Master of Engineering offered by the Department of Agricultural, Food and Nutritional Sciences is being suspended due to low enrolment and concerns about having a MEng outside of the Faculty of Engineering including APEGA accreditation. She added that there is one student currently enrolled the program, and that the intention is to terminate the program once that student has completed. She further noted that an MSc in Food Science is the typical program of choice for prospective students in this area.

The General Academic Standing Requirements have been added to the Calendar with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and the allowance of only one failed course.
